Suburban Hospital: Serving Montgomery County

Suburban Hospital is Montgomery County's designated trauma center, a primary stroke center, a leading provider of services to surgical patients – and one of the County's largest private employers. Through Potomac Home Health Care (a joint venture with Sibley Memorial Hospital), Suburban also provides home health care to patients throughout the County. Suburban is currently undergoing a major transformation, including a new parking garage for over 1,100 vehicles which opened in July 2017. A new 300,000-square-foot hospital building, with all-private rooms, 14 operating suites, including some equipped for robotic surgery and hybrid imaging, a conference center, and physicians' offices, will be completed in 2020.

Precision Medicine Group, Bethesda, founded by a JH alumnus, provides consulting and support services for pharmaceutical and life sciences companies in the field of precision medicine

NexImmune, Gaithersburg, is developing immunotherapy treatments for cancer and other diseases based on technology licensed from JH

Insilico Medicine, Rockville, founded by a JH alumnus, is using AI to improve drug discovery and development

Neuraly, Germantown, founded in 2016, is developing new treatments for neurodegenerative diseases, using technology licensed from JH

Mind-X, Bethesda, founded by a JH alum based on technology licensed from APL, is developing brain-computer interface technologies

The Montgomery County Campus: Education, research and entrepreneurship

The Johns Hopkins campus in Rockville offers graduate programs in the arts and sciences, continuing education for seniors, space for start-ups and small companies – with 23 tenants as of mid-2019 – and a wide range of community programs. The Montgomery County Campus is also home to 575,000 square feet of facilities for the National Cancer Institute. A new 75,000-square-foot building will be completed in 2020.
